

Nottingham Festival of Science and Curiosity 2019 - FOSAC launches this week, with local library science activities playing a big part in the half-term holiday festival programme.

Storytelling, games and hands-on activities will be part of the Family Science Fun days taking place in The Meadows (18th Feb), Clifton (19th) and Strelley (20th) libraries. Meanwhile, young engineers can put their skills to the test in a city-wide Rocket Challenge taking place at Radford-Lenton and Sherwood (18th Feb), Bilborough and Wollaton (19th), and Southglade and Dales Centre libraries (20th).

All the events are free and open to all ages. On Sunday 17th both Wollaton Hall and the Urban Room @38 Carrington Street will be open for SEND children and their families, providing safe, quieter spaces for STEM learning exploration.
