Offsite/Educational Visit Coordinator Training 4th April 2019 - DfE guidelines state: *Schools should appoint an Educational Visits Coordinator and make sure they have the training they need.* For Nottingham City Council maintained schools, Off Site/Educational Visit Coordinators must be nominated by the Head of establishment. An update to the training must be attended every 3 years. It is also recommended that academies follow this best practice. [more information](#)
