Funding Opportunity for Good Food in schools - Following March's Primary Parliament sessions, Nottingham's young leaders went back to school brimming with ideas for growing good food in schools. However due to funding and timetable pressures, making their dreams a reality will always be challenging.

The Greening Charity [Trees for Cities](#) are now working with schools in Nottingham to bring fruit and veg into the outdoor classroom. By learning in an [Edible Playground](#) – fully equipped with raised beds, trellising, a greenhouse, composting etc., Children can grow year-round and learn while they are doing so. A year's worth of expert training for the school comes with the Edible Playground programme and ensures schools are fully equipped to maximise the potential of their space.

Funding of £25,000 has been made available to a small number of Nottingham flagship Primary schools. [Find out more here](#)

National Child Employment Raising Awareness Month - This April, local authorities will be joining together to raise the profile of children of compulsory school age working part time legally. No

child under the age of 13 years can be employed to work, the law specifies the permitted hours, types of employment and makes it a requirement for employers to apply for a permit. Employers who breach this legislation are risking the safety of young people and can face a fine of up to £1000.
