The week commencing 16th November saw Primary parliament take place for the second time in a virtual environment. Classrooms and home-offices united on Microsoft teams to engage in workshops that saw pupils from various schools in Nottingham share their creative ideas for the redevelopment of Broadmarsh. The workshops were centred around the ideas of Broadmarsh being a green place, somewhere that children and families can be curious and creative, and a place that celebrates Nottingham's rebellious past.

Liz and Sandra from the Libraries team also joined us to showcase a 'virtual tour' of what the new central library being built next to Broadmarsh will look like inside when finished. The goal is for this to be the "best children's library in the world".



Primary Parliament sessions enable primaryaged children to share their ideas and opinions on City-wide issues as well as helping them develop the confidence to become young leaders of the future.

The pupils worked in teams to come up with some brilliant ideas, including growing plants/vegetables on the roof of Broadmarsh, creating a Robin Hood themed archery range, a community graffiti wall that is wiped clean weekly and a swimming pool inside the caves!

In the afternoon the pupils presented their ideas to other schools in attendance, Council partners and Councillors in various creative ways. Colourful posters and visuals were displayed as well as songs/raps and even a mock news report acted out.

Councillor Cheryl Barnard closed the session by thanking the pupils for their hard work and valuable ideas.
