SOLAR Swim - The National Curriculum requirement of swimming 25 Meters unaided and possessing water safety knowledge is a challenging target and school support in achieving this is invaluable, as not all children participate in out of school lessons or activities. However, the School Swimming Service is continuing to buck the trend and over the past four years we have seen the percentage of children who can achieve the national curriculum requirement rise from 27% to 48%.
